Manager's Report

School Department Capital Projects

Regular Update:

- I participated in last week's meeting of the School Department Building Advisory Committee. While I will provide an update here, I encourage anyone interested to [view this meeting](#) on the archived footage on the NKSD website as it was lengthy and covered a lot of information.
 - The Committee received a presentation on the various Construction Delivery Methods available for the middle school project. it was a presentation only; no votes were taken.
 - The Committee also received an update on the status of the Stage II submittal with RIDE from the Superintendent. He explained that they've been in regular contact regarding their feedback, redesign, and they plan to share a plan with the School Committee at their May 6th meeting prior to submitting to RIDE on May 7th.
 - The most important topic was a review of a revised Middle School design and cost options. One way to reduce costs significantly (by approx. \$6 million) would be to remove the Net Zero concept, but there did not seem to be an appetite to remove this concept.
 - Another concept would be to add Pre-School programs to the building, but this would only increase the footprint and increase the cost of the project, leaving less for capital improvements elsewhere.
 - Another option would be to increase enrollment to 525 students. This would create a disparity with Davisville Middle School while increasing the RIDE reimbursement from \$19.4 million to \$23.8 million.
 - The final option, which was supported by NKSD Administration and unanimously supported by the Building Advisory Committee, would be to add a third floor, eliminate some luxuries and reduce the overall square footage of the building by 3,400 sq ft, ultimately reducing the cost of the building by approx. \$8.1 million, allowing these funds to be used for other capital improvements and increase the eligibility of the building for the 35% RIDE reimbursement from 65% to 72.3% of the Middle School Project.
 - I believe the Superintendent will be bringing this proposal to the School Committee as the Building Committee is advisory only.



Public Safety Complex Project

Regular Update:

- We continue to make significant progress during our internal staff Public Safety Complex Bond Project work sessions. We are currently reevaluating some efficiency and cost-savings measures by placing Fire Administration at Station One versus a combined Police/Fire complex at Quonset.
 - We are attempting to process to a draft footprint for consideration and we are evaluating the potential need for relocation of our fueling system.
 - We continue to work on the Quonset site with the hope of finalizing a purchase and sale tentative Agreement for review before Town Council.
 - My hope is for another 4-8 weeks of internal staff meetings before hosting a Public Meeting for a presentation of where we are, along with opportunity for Public Comment.

Revolution Wind



Regular Update: Offshore Wind Farm

- We had our regular bi-weekly meeting with Revolution Wind regarding their **Offshore Wind Farm Project** in Quonset Business Park.
 - Construction and the importing of cable is going well.
 - They are scheduling the delivery of a condenser which is not expected to have any impact to the neighborhood or abutters.
 - Outreach is going smoothly with no new concerns, and we are awaiting dates from Orsted and Revolution Wind regarding a small tour for staff who participate in our bi-weekly calls.

Wickford Waterfront Project

- A very limited update: our Solicitor is actively involved in all aspects of this project and our discussions with the surety company.
 - We met with our consultant last week and were advised that they are proceeding with awarding a bid to a new contractor. The new contractor has been advised of all events taking place within Wickford over these next 6-months as well as my, and the Town's request that the steel pilings, fencing, and debris be removed by Memorial Day weekend.
 - Our goal is to get the project back up and running, on-time with a significant aesthetic improvement to the area by the next holiday weekend.
- I will continue to keep the Council and public up to date with these updates.

Annual Meeting & Awards Ceremony

- Along with Council President Mancini and Councilperson Matt McCoy, I attended last week's North Kingstown Chamber of Commerce Annual Meeting and Awards night.
 - My, and our, **congratulations to Ben Mandel** of our Planning Department on his award for his work in in Economic Development and Business Outreach within our community.
 - This recognition is well-deserved as Ben's efforts have been appreciated and recognized where he has achieved proven results.

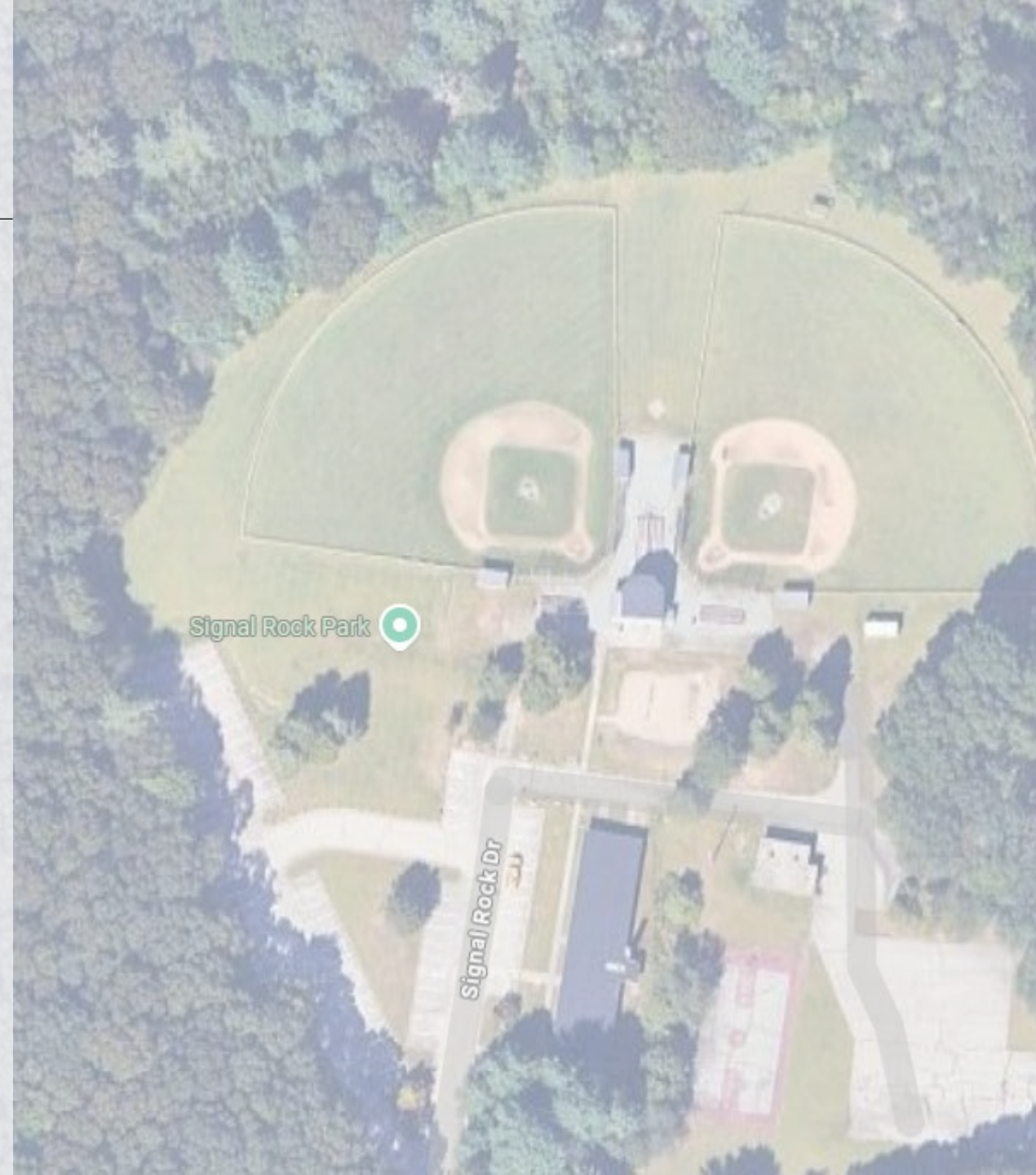
RI Department of Transportation

- We had a virtual meeting with RIDOT last week which was followed up by a call between Dave Walsh of RIDOT and me later on in the week. We continue to express the concerns of our Public Safety and Public Works Departments relative to their upcoming Frenchtown Road Bridge, South County Trail Bridge and the Devils Foot Road/Railroad Bridge projects over the next 15-months. We are hoping to hear back on these concerns.
- Design and engineering work continues regarding the **Post Road/West Main Street Sidewalk Project**. RIDOT is working and discussing with our staff regularly regarding concerns and suggestions. It appears they hope to begin work sometime in 2026/27 with the project completed in late 2027.
- The bid for the **Wickford mini-roundabout** project was advertised on March 31st, with a scheduled bid award for May 2nd.
 - Their goal is to have all work conducted at night to eliminate traffic issues. They estimate work commencing sometime after Labor Day, with a mid-October completion date.
 - We are awaiting confirmation but **an informational meeting with a tentative date of May 14th, at 5:30 p.m.** here in Council Chambers has been set aside for Wickford businesses and residents where RIDOT will present details on the project. *Attendees will have the opportunity to answer questions, but the meeting is not a venue for design suggestions or questions on whether the project's status is under consideration as the bid and design will have already been completed.*
 - This is an opportunity for RIDOT to work with businesses and residents and address questions as to how the project will be moving forward and best avoid disturbances for these stakeholder groups.
- **RIDOT has also announced overnight and weekend lane closures beginning later this week, on Route 1 at the Route 138 interchange starting May 1st to complete their bridge project.**
 - We will continue to promote this news on our website and social media platforms.

Updates

Signal Rock

- Funding was previously approved by Council, and we've since completed significant demolition of deteriorated buildings at this park.
- We've completed significant field improvements as well.
- The next step is for us to develop a master plan for the park campus and to bring it to Town Council for approval when complete.
 - This is currently on hold as we complete Yorktown Park and Ryan Park improvements but hope to bring a concept before you in the next 6-months.



Boards & Commissions

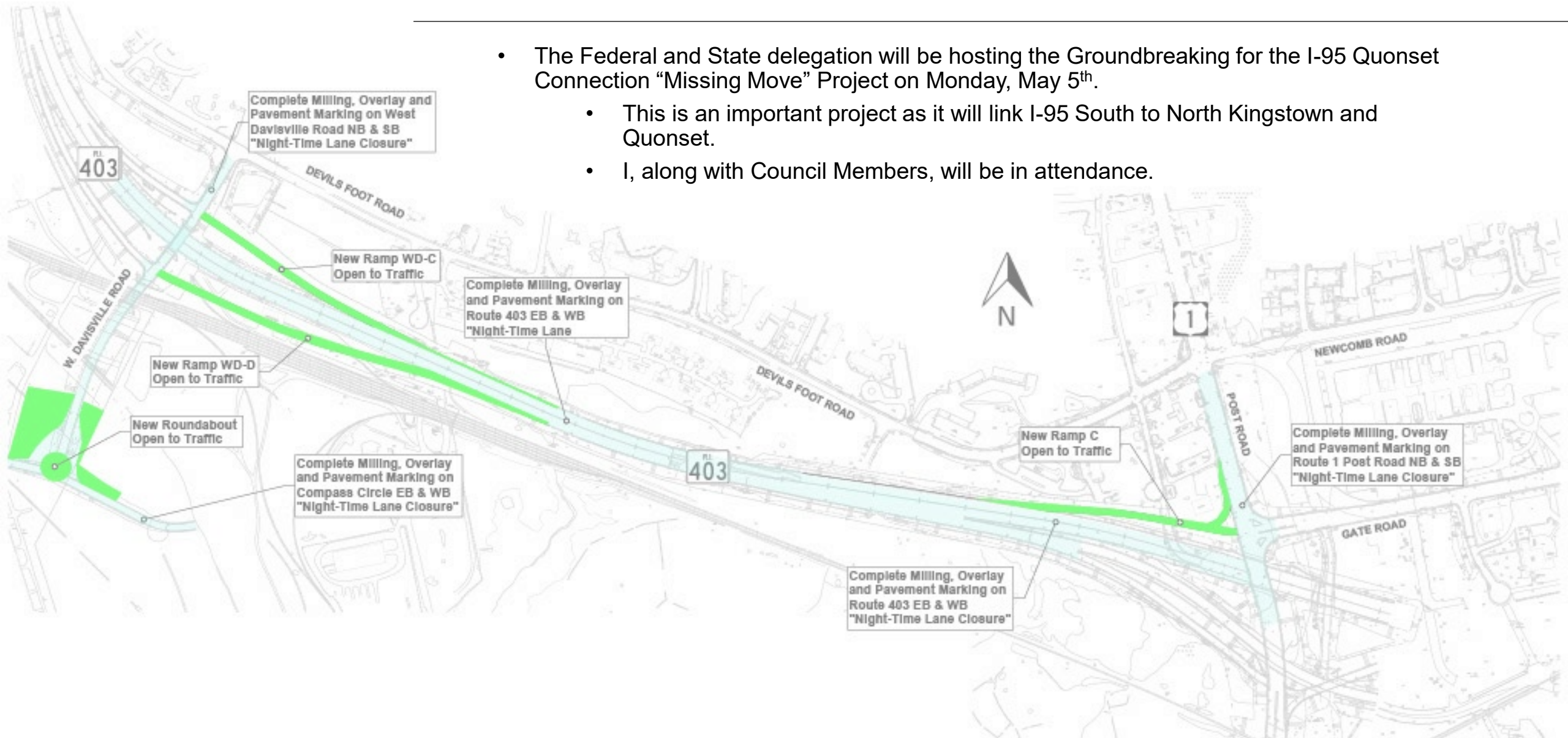
